Diplomas

Diplomas are mailed to graduates approximately 90 days after all coursework has been completed and grades have been posted. Please verify that the Office of the Registrar has your correct address.

Where to go

Check In

Follow the signs to the graduate check in and line up area.

It is important to be punctual so that we can verify your attendance. You are required to check in at the student check in table for your major. Your name will not be called if you do not check in and collect your index card.

You will then line up with the department or program with whom you are graduating from.

Coat Check

Coat check will be provided for students. Please ensure you allocate extra time to check in/out your personal items. While the coat check will be staffed at all times, the University is not liable for the loss of personal belongings.

Parking & Transportation

Parking is available for a fee at the venue.

The venue is accessible via public transportation. We suggest using Google maps to find the best route for your visit.

What time to arrive

Check-in is required TWO HOURS prior to your ceremony!

There are many important steps to prepare for your big day. If you arrive less than two hours prior to your ceremony, you run the risk of not walking with your department. Please don't be late!

Please note that guests will not be admitted until ONE HOUR prior to the ceremony.



What happens during the ceremony

The Processional

The procession will be led by the Master of Ceremony. All graduating students march into the auditorium in celebration of their Commencement. Graduates remain standing for the entire processional.

Recognition of Graduating Students

We will continue the tradition of having each graduate's name read while he or she walks across the stage after their name has been called.

Each graduate will be presented with a commemorative scroll, and each graduate will be photographed by a professional photographer. Please be respectful and refrain from taking "selfies" while on stage.

Out of respect for all participants, graduates must stay throughout the entire ceremony and must remain seated unless otherwise directed by faculty marshals.

The Recessional

President Stephens, University executives recess first; then, the faculty members. Finally, the graduates exit, beginning with the front rows.

What happens after the ceremony

Graduates are asked to meet their family/guests at a pre-determined location outside. Should family wish to present you with flowers, please ask them to do so after the ceremony.

Behavior and Line up Information

Commencement is a dignified occasion. Participants are expected to conduct themselves accordingly. The behavior of each graduate helps to set the tone for this important event. Graduates and families look forward to this milestone with excitement and anticipation. For many guests, Commencement is their first visit to our campus. The ceremony and appropriate behavior by the graduates will create positive memories for all who attend. Students and guests are expected to remain seated until the ceremony has concluded.



Guest Information

Protocol

Commencement marks the pinnacle of academic achievement, and the university proudly celebrates the occasion with formal pomp and circumstance. Please help us provide a memorable event for all involved.

- To be considerate of other guests and graduates we ask that you do not bring noise makers, utilize umbrellas, or stand in the aisles during the Commencement Ceremony.
- Each guest must have a ticket for entry.
- Guests should be seated before the procession begins; late arrivals must wait until the procession ends.
- Cell phones and electronic devices should be placed on silent mode.
- Please remain for the entire ceremony as a sign of respect for all graduates.

Audience members are welcome to take photographs throughout the ceremony, provided they remain in their seats and do not block aisles or egresses.
